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### **CALL TO ORDER:**

Chair Gutierrez called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

### **ATTENDANCE:**

Chair Gutierrez, Vice Chair Doran, Commissioners Richards, Buelt, Finch, McBurney, Valentino and Katipamula. Commissioner Beck excused. Also in attendance were Council Liaison Kent, Parks and Public Facilities Director Schiessl, Parks and Public Facilities Managers Pinard and Strand, Parks and Facilities Supervisor.

### **APPROVAL OF THE April 10, 2014 AGENDA:**

### **COUNCIL LIASON REPORT:**

Debbie Berkowitz, 544 Franklin St., Richland- Representing the Ridges to Rivers Open Space Network (RROSN) presented a copy of the American Planners Magazine in which the RROSN was awarded the National Planning Excellence Award for a Grassroots Initiative.

George Kyriazls, President of the HOA of Horn Rapids, also would like the City of Richland to consider a dog park in the north part of Richland.

### **RECREATION REPORT:**

Parks and Public Facilities Manager Laurel Strand welcomed the public and informed all of the following events:

### **PARKS AND FACILITIES REPORT:**

Facilities Supervisor Darrin Sweeney reported the following updates and progress throughout the City:

- Renovation of Wiser Field at Badger Mountain Park. took all the sod and rotivated the field and brought in a hardy turf.
- Applying herbicides, pesticides and fertilizers in the parks.
- Installing a new roof at George Prout pool work will be completed before the pool opens for the swimming season.
- Renovations and maintenance on the docks.
- John Dam Plaza project is near the completion of the master plan.

### **PRESENTATIONS:**

- 1) North Leslie Groves Natural Area Restoration Group  
Debbie Berkowitz, presented an overview of completed and scheduled projects at the corner of Snyder St. and Harris Street. The project was made possible by utilizing funds from the 2013 Park Partnership Program funds. Berkowitz noted that the funds help purchase and install a split rail fence to replace the utility pole fence.
- 2) Tri City Radio Control Modelers (TCRCM)

Bill Bowen, President from TCRCM presented an overview of the accomplishments and upcoming events coming this year. Bowen noted that piloting a powered, radio controlled aircraft is much more difficult than most people realize. The TCRCM provides free introduction flights for anyone interested aged 12 and over. In addition, they provide free instruction through solo flight for any member, using your aircraft and radio equipment. Members are also more than willing to provide advice and assistance in selecting a training aircraft, construction and setup and for more information in regards to the TCRCM to visit the website for an updated schedule of events.

### **1. 2014 Park Partnership Program Applications**

Parks and Recreation Manager Phil Pinard presented the annual Park Partnership Applications and Grant Applications. Mr. Pinard noted that this year there are six applications that were submitted: Columbia River Disk Golf Club requesting \$1200, Tri-City Dog Park Society requesting \$5000, North Leslie Groves Natural Area Restoration Group requesting \$4900, Columbia Basin BMX requesting \$3040, Richland Senior Association requesting \$5000 and Sundance Ridge HOA requesting \$5000, for a total of \$24,140.

- 1) Columbia River Disk Golf Club, Kyle Smart, President: Purchase and install wood chips, tee signs and supplies to paint picnic tables.
- 2) Tri-City Dog Park Society, Denise Sliger, Member and Charlene Reck, Secretary: Purchase and install a third human/K9 drinking fountain, three benches, dog waste dispensers and trees.
- 3) North Leslie Groves Natural Area Restoration Group, Debbie Berkowitz: Backpack spraying, fabric matting and plants and 3-rail split rail fence.
- 4) Columbia Basin BMX, Kevin Rowe, volunteer: purchase and install sod and contract for hydro seeding.
- 5) Richland Senior Association (RSA), Stan Spohr: purchase ADA accessible tables, chairs and shade umbrellas.
- 6) Sundance Ridge HOA, Becky Mayer: Irrigation and landscaping improvements.

Commissioner Buelt **moved** that the Parks and Recreation Commission recommend to the City Council, approval of the following Park Partnership funding requests:

Columbia River Disk Golf Club \$1300, Tri-City Dog Park Society \$4040, North Leslie Groves Natural Area Restoration Group \$4040, Columbia Basin BMX \$2540, Richland Senior Association \$4040 and Sundance Ridge HOA \$4040. Nancy Doran **seconded** the motion. Motion carried.

### GENERAL INFORMATION

APPLICANT: CITY OF RICHLAND

REQUEST: APPROVAL OF THE 2015-2020, SIX-YEAR TRANSPORTATION  
IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

LOCATION: THROUGHOUT THE CITY OF RICHLAND

### REASON FOR REQUEST:

To comply with the Revised Code of Washington (RCW 35.77.010) which requires all cities to annually update their Transportation Improvement Plans and RMC 2.18.040 Section E requiring that the Parks and Recreation Commission comment and make recommendations on the annual city long range transportation plan.

### BACKGROUND:

Each year, the City is required to update its Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and file a copy of the adopted TIP with the State Department of Transportation. The TIP is a planning tool for federal, state, and local governments and is utilized by state and federal funding agencies in awarding funds for transportation improvement projects. Once adopted by Council and pursuant to a public hearing, the TIP may be amended any time to add funding, add or remove projects, and modify project scope and/or limits.

The Six-Year TIP is derived from projects that have been identified in the City's Transportation Plan, Comprehensive Plan and the Benton Franklin Council of Government's Regional Transportation Plan. Projects shown in the Six-Year TIP are those projects from the previously mentioned planning documents that the City feels have a reasonable possibility of being funded within the next six years.

There are a total of 22 projects shown on the Six-Year TIP. The following is a list of projects that incorporate bike lanes, trails, and multi-use trails:

#### Multit-use trail projects

1. Queensgate Pathway – Keene Road to I-182 Pathway (***grant funding secured***).
2. Vantage Highway Pathway, Phase 1 – Stevens Drive to Kingsgate Way (***applying for Bike/Ped grant***).

3. Stevens Drive Pathway – Spengler Street to Horn Rapids Road.
4. Vantage Highway Pathway, Phase 2 – Kingsgate Way to Twin Bridges Road.

#### Transportation projects incorporating bike lanes and trails

1. Duportail Bridge – Sidewalks and bike lanes on roadway; separated multi-use pathway on bridge structure; improved trail system along Yakima River.
2. Center Parkway Extension – Sidewalks and bike lanes on both sides. (**fully funded**)
3. Stevens Drive Extension – Sidewalks and bike lanes on both sides. (**fully funded**)
4. Duportail Street Reconstruction – Sidewalks and bike lanes on both sides. (**fully funded**)
5. Duportail Street Extension – Sidewalks and bike lanes on both sides. (**fully funded**)
6. Swift Corridor Improvements – Road diet; improved pedestrian facilities; bike lanes (**applying for Bike/Ped grant**)
7. Columbia Park Trail East – Sidewalks and bike lanes on both sides.
8. SR 240/Kingsgate Way Traffic Signal – Improved pedestrian access across SR 240 (**partially funded**)
9. Gage Boulevard Improvements – Sidewalks and bike lanes on both sides.
10. Bellerive Drive Extension – Sidewalks and bike lanes on both sides.
11. Rachel Road Improvements – Bike and pedestrian facilities will be provided but location and type yet to be determined pending further study.

#### FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

1. RCW Section 35.77.010 requires cities to annually update their six-year Transportation Improvement Program.
2. Staff has identified projects from the Citywide Transportation Plan, Comprehensive Plan, and Regional Transportation Plan that have a reasonable possibility of being funded in the next six years that will best serve the multi-modal transportation needs of the City.
3. Staff has prepared the 2015 – 2020 Transportation Improvement Program and has identified those projects in the long range transportation plan that contain bicycle lanes, trails, and multi-use trails.

## RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Commission concur with the findings and conclusions set forth in the staff report and forward a recommendation to the City Council to approve the 2015-2020 Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program.

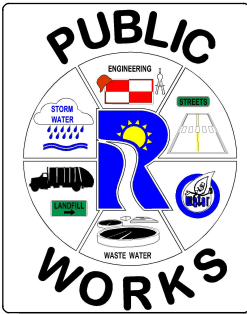

## **Planning and Construction Division**

### **Richland Fire Station #74 Status**

On Thursday, March 20 Richland Staff along with our consultant Hill International presented the City's application for design-build authority to the Washington Project Review Board. The State approval would allow the use of the alternate public work delivery method for the design and construction of Fire Station #74. This would be an advantage to the City on schedule and budget. The authority is requested under a pilot program for public work projects between three and ten million.

The Board unanimously approved the City's application. Richland is the first agency to receive a project approval under the pilot program and the first agency to propose and receive approval for a contract structure that will result in a guaranteed maximum price and a fixed fee for a defined scope and minimum project elements.

A request for qualification for builder/design teams is currently being advertised. A City team will narrow the resulting statements of qualifications to a short list of three for proprietary interviews and to move into a request for proposal round. The final three will receive a small honorarium to complete conceptual design, schedule, price and fee proposals. A City team will select the top builder/design team based on a scoring schedule. At this point we expect to issue a notice to proceed June 16 this year with occupancy by February 11, 2015.

### **Columbia Playfield Outfield Fence Replacement**

Work is progress on schedule with the fence modifications at Columbia Playfield. Siefken & Sons of Richland are the general contractors. This project involves moving the outfield fences out on the four softball fields at Columbia Playfield to keep the fields competitive for collegiate tournaments. This project was funded through Hotel/Motel funds.

Construction of the sidewalk has been completed.

### **Wiser Field**
